Agenda items

The following agenda items were discussed:

1) Introduction

Marigold Norman (MN) welcomed Stuart Goodall to the Reference Board. Stuart is the Chief Executive of ConFor and replaces Martin Gale.

2) Update on action points from last Reference Board meeting

The Reference Board (RB) was consulted on plans to publish the assessments of the legality verification systems or 'Category B schemes' and it was agreed that the systems which provide sufficient evidence of compliance with the legality criteria and CoC will be listed on the CPET website.

All other action points listed at the last RB meeting had been completed.

3) Update on Implementation of the policy

The Reference Board were notified that the Construction Sector Pilot Study was published in June 2008 and Defra has been addressing the recommendations. A reporting pilot is being developed in Defra which will highlight the resources required for monitoring and reporting on timber volume. This will be an opportunity to develop and test approaches to monitoring

and reporting, which can be shared with other government departments. It will also provide data on timber volume and the volume of timber supplied through Cat A and B in Defra.

The Guidance document is being tested on Defra contractors to ensure that it is easy for procurement officials to implement. An executive summary and flow chart of key actions through the procurement process have been added.

Defra is continuing to work with John White and Julia Young (TTF and WWF) on a joint implementation strategy aimed at encouraging local authorities to develop a responsible sourcing policy for timber. A meeting was held in June to discuss local authority development and implementation of timber procurement policies. Around ten London authorities attended. The meeting discussed next steps and agreed to work with the GLA to feed into the wider sustainable procurement agenda while focusing on construction. Defra also hopes to work closely with the North East Regional Improvement and Efficiency Partnership, to share expertise on sustainable procurement in the public sector.

A number of articles have been published in relevant journals since the last Reference Board meeting to raise awareness of the timber procurement policy.

Defra continues an ongoing dialogue with the European Commission on the inclusion of social criteria within the government definition of sustainability. A study by Chatham House on social issues will be finalised in the coming months.

#### 4) Category A review

Neil Judd (NJ) summarised the review of the five forest certification schemes. The Technical Panel convened in Oxford for a 3 day workshop in early July. The panel consisted of the following members:

The RB was presented with the findings of the technical panel. The discussion focused on each of the five certification schemes in turn. The RB agreed that the guidance for evaluating certification schemes should be reviewed prior to the next assessment in 2010. This was in line with the recommendations of the Technical Panel.

The RB agreed that the certification schemes should be contacted for any further information, following the findings of the panel. The technical panel and RB will then be

consulted again before Defra Ministers provide advice on the results, and subsequent publication of the assessment results in the autumn.
