



The government's timber procurement policy has changed: make sure you are up-to-date

All central government departments, executive agencies and non-departmental public bodies have to comply with the UK government timber procurement policy. This applies to products such as paper, furniture and construction timber (including temporary site works and materials provided by contractors). The current policy, updated in April 2010, demands that all timber and timber products should be bought from independently verifiable legal and sustainable sources, or is FLEGT licensed.

Who should attend these workshops?

Anyone involved in policy development or enforcement
for example sustainability officers and facility managers

Anyone specifying and managing public sector contracts
and orders for example procurement officers

Anyone buying timber or wood-derived products for the
public sector (paper, furniture or construction materials)
for example buyers, facility managers

All contractors or suppliers to the public sector for
example architects, construction companies, furniture
manufacturers, timber merchants and importers.



Attend the free training workshops

In order to get the whole public sector up to speed with the policy, Defra is sponsoring workshops which provide practical advice on how to meet the requirements as a buyer or supplier. The workshop lasts for one day and covers: responsible purchasing, illegal logging, the UK Government Policy, definitions, the types of evidence that are available and how to check them and topics such as contract conditions and implementation.

It will work through several case studies to examine the types of evidence available, and to ensure you are confident in assessing evidence back in the work place.
